Tribute to Senator Jun Enverga

The Filipino Community are deeply saddened to the untimely passing of the Hon. Tobias C. Enverga Jr. (Founder of PCCF), who suffered a heart attack while attending the 14 Plenary Assembly of ParlAmericas, the institution that promotes parliamentary diplomacy in the inter-American system, in Medellin, Colombia. The conference was scheduled on November 15-17, Senator Enverga, Jr., representing Canada, died on the 16th.

Senator Enverga was a tireless advocate for the Filipino Community, he was a trusted friend, devoted husband to Rosemer and beloved father to Rystle, Rocel and Reeza.



We were very shocked and saddened to lose a very caring, dedicated, sincere friend who showed extreme care for his family and to our community. It is a big loss to all of us to lose the Senator.

Senator Tobias Enverga Jr. will always be in our hearts and always be in our memories and prayers and will be remembered....

Sen. Tobias C. Enverga Jr.was active in advocacies both at the international and domestic level. He was the founder of the "Philippine Canadian Charitable Foundation (PCCF)" in 2010, helping and donating monies for charity both in Canada and the Philippines.

In 2008, he was the recipient of the "Lingkod sa Kapwa Pilipino (LINKAPIL)" presidential award given to him by the former president of the Philippines, Gloria Macapagal Arroyo.

In 2010, he was elected as trustee for Ward 8 of the Toronto Catholic District School Board, which made him the first Filipino-Canadian elected to public office in the city of Toronto, and the first member of a visible ethnic minority elected to the Board. While serving on the Catholic District School Board, besides his many hours of volunteer work to several organizations serving the needs of different communities.

In 2012, he was one of the recipients of the "Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal" for his exceptional and meritorious service.

Seeing his generous character and ability to serve the common good, Prime Minister Stephen Harper appointed him to the Senate on September 6, 2012. Since his appointment to the Senate of Canada, many observed that the Senator, aside from attending to his normal duties as senator, he was everywhere; at various festivities of Filipino organizations, birthdays, anniversaries or even funerals in Toronto or in Mississauga, particularly.

Eternal rest on his soul and may perpetual light shine upon him.

Unknown to others, Mama Ching would approach Dr. Solon on a personal basis during some financial crunch as KCCC was trying to stabilize its resources.
